## Newborn Screening Bulletin 2023-8

Biliary atresia screening update and ordering Infant Stool Colour Cards (ISCCs):

We want to thank you for your continued contribution to newborn screening and the implementation and distribution of ISCCs. Since the launch of biliary atresia screening in January 2023:

- > 85,000 families have received an ISCC
- > 200 families have contacted NSO due to concern regarding pale stool
- 27 babies have been referred for follow-up due to confirmed pale stool

Through our program, babies have been identified with biliary atresia and received life -saving interventions.

Many of you have reached out asking how to re-order ISCCs. As a reminder, you can order the ISCCs at no cost the same way you order newborn screening dried blood spot cards, through the distributor VWR. Please note that ordering dried blood spot collection cards does not automatically order ISCCs. <u>Click here for additional instructions</u>.

NEWBORN SCREENING ONTARIO DEPISTAGE NEONATAL ONTARIO

The recommended best practice is to document the distribution of the ISCC in the patient record, along with the education provided to the parents/guardians. Education should include the need to screen for the first month of life and to contact NSO with any concern regarding pale stool.
