Newborn screening over the holidays and upcoming changes

With the holidays approaching, we would like to inform you of the courier schedule and provide you with some tips to ensure timely newborn screening. Please forward this bulletin to any members of your team who will be involved in newborn screening collection or shipping over the holidays. We have also included upcoming changes regarding screen positive reports, and news about our website and resources.

Courier downtimes over the holiday period:

- No ad-hoc pick up requests on Saturday, December 23rd or Saturday, December 30th regular Saturday deliveries will occur (shipments picked up on Friday will be delivered to NSO on Saturday).
- Purolator will NOT be operational during the following time periods:
 - Sunday, December 24th Tuesday, December 26th inclusive
 - Sunday, December 31st Monday, January 1st inclusive

Special Notice to Midwifery Practice Groups

If requesting a pick up on Friday, December 22nd or Friday, December 29th, please do so as early as possible and provide a wide window of time for the pick up.

If midwifery practice groups are not able to request a pickup on Friday, December 22nd or Friday, December 29th, samples can still be shipped to NSO by dropping the shipment off at an authorized Purolator location. Please click here to find the most convenient drop-off location for you.

Tips to ensure timely newborn screening:

NSO will be working throughout the holiday period to ensure testing is done quickly despite any courier delays. To minimize potential delays caused by holiday downtimes, please do the following:

- Collect newborn screens between 24-48 hours of life. If an infant is discharged at <24 hours of age, please
 collect a newborn screen before discharge and ask the family to return in the next 24 hours for a repeat
 screen.
- Deliver samples to your shipping location (e.g. lab, unit clerk, practice office etc.) as soon as possible.
- Ship samples every business day, as soon as they are dry.
- If you are requesting a new pick up over the holiday period, a reminder to do so early in the day and to provide a wide window of time for Purolator to pick up your samples.
- Please closely review requisitions for completeness to reduce the likelihood a sample will be deemed
 unsatisfactory as a result of missing information. This is especially important for midwifery practice groups
 with offices that will be closed over the holiday period.















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Upcoming in 2024: Updated website and educational Submitter Hub

 Our website will have a new look in early 2024! In January, we will be launching our updated website and Submitter Hub, an updated online submitter manual and educational hub for health care providers involved in newborn screening. Stay tuned for more information early in the new year!

Change in practice: Faxing screen positive reports

NSO sends screen positive reports to hospitals and midwifery practices once NSO has referred the baby to a Regional Treatment Centre and the family is aware of the newborn screening result. Previously, these reports had been sent in an individual fax job with a cover letter.

Beginning December 18, NSO will fax screen positive reports along with other newborn screening reports that do not require follow-up. There will continue to be a note at the bottom of every screen positive report (see next page for example), indicating that a referral has been made and to which Regional Treatment Centre. The upcoming change will streamline the reporting workflow and allow these results to go out in a timely manner, with fewer manual steps.

o Infants with meaonium ileus are at risk of having Cystic Fibrosis (CF) but will often have a screen negative result for CF; it is therefore recommended that they be dinically evaluated for CF regardless of the newborn screening results.
