## **Greetings from Newborn Screening Ontario!**

Thank you to all frontline healthcare professionals who make our screening program a success. Your parent education and support leads to early detection and better outcomes for Ontario infants.

**Urgent Action Needed:** We have received reports that some parents are finding the Infant Stool Colour Card (ISCC) in their discharge package sometimes as late as one month after discharge. **This poop card must be handed directly to parents, along with an explanation of its importance and instructions on how to use it.**

- Audio Ads: Podcast and radio ads aired early summer, reached audiences in everyday moments.


#### **Poop Happens! Pens**
